We are very grateful for the generosity of the local community who donate food so we are able to make food available for those in need. A few items we are often short of are:

- Long-life Milk and Juice Tinned Rice Pudding and Custard • Corned Beef • Tinned Carrots

Where possible it is best if you can donate smaller packs of items rather than 'bulk' items as these can be distributed to more people in crisis.

GDPR

New GDPR regulations came into force from 25 May 2018. We hope you are happy to continue to receive emails from Bridgend Foodbank but please contact us. if you wish to opt out.



We will be closed on Friday 19 April, and would be grateful to receive all Easter donations as early as possible in order that we can distribute to our eleven centres within the Borough in time.

Bridgend Foodbank distributed three days emergency food supplies to 6,711 people in crisis (includes 1,994 children) from January to December 2018.

Sadly, this figure is not expected to reduce significantly any time soon. Despite this, we can still make a difference. By working together with our local community

we are tackling poverty here in Bridgend County.

Emergency food parcels are available for collection between 10am and 12pm on a Saturday and Monday morning from 9.30 – 1.00 pm for people who find themselves without food at weekends. People do not need vouchers but must provide some proof of how many people are in their household.

e-vouchers

Our e-voucher system, which makes it easier for referral agencies to issue vouchers, and monitor who is accessing the service. They will look exactly the same but Referral Agencies will print their own vouchers so will never run out!!!
